Identify genes that cause disease



Discover new medications to help patients



Find predictors (also called biomarkers) for disease



Understand which medicines are best for each individual patient



Predict which children can safely stop medication

Steps for Participating in Biosample Collection



Informed Consent Form

Your doctor and/or research coordinator will obtain your permission with an Informed Consent Form.

What is That?



- Information about the study
- What to expect
- Risks and benefits of participating
- Privacy information

What might we need from you?



99% of the time your doctor will draw a few extra teaspoons of blood to use for your biosample

Other samples might include joint fluid, stool, urine or tissue



Don't be Afraid to Ask Questions

- Participation is always voluntary
- You can change your mind at any time
- · Ask your doctor if you're confused
